“Nic at Night”

Ames Christian School students brought the encounter of Jesus with a certain religious leader to life in their performance of “Nic at Night” at Stonebrook Church on April 24. The story of Easter was also told through the eyes of Nicodemus, the Pharisee, who met with Jesus late at night and learned what it meant to be born again.

Three ACS actors played the elite group of Pharisees who did not understand why someone like Nicodemus, with so much training and wisdom, would need salvation from Jesus. Other children portrayed followers of Jesus, who explained that all are sinners, even the religious leaders, but God loved the world so much that He gave his son Jesus to die for the sins of all. This great promise unfolded onstage as the actors learned of Jesus’ crucifixion and sang, “Were you there



when they crucified my Lord?” But the sadness did not last for long, because Joseph of Arimathea ran on stage proclaiming to Jesus’ disheartened followers that He had risen from the dead! The choir sang joyously, “The First Lord’s Day,” and the audience joined them in, “Christ the Lord Has Risen Today.”

Other song highlights included “Born Brand New,” comparing the transformation of a caterpillar to a butterfly with new life in Christ, as well as “Secret Disciples,” about standing up for the faith. The song, “Do You See What the Pharisees Saw,” explored the inability of the Pharisees to see the loving kindness of Jesus through all their rules and regulations.

The three year old preschool class sang a medley of five songs about

Easter, God’s love, and salvation, with narration from several 1st and 2nd graders.

After the performance, everyone enjoyed a reception provided by the ACS parents.
